Hatzolah Returning Home

There is a well known teshuva from Rav Moshe Feinstein regarding paramedics and doctors who went on an emergency call whether they can drive back home on Shabbos. Rav Moshe (Igros Moshe, O.C. 4:80) permits them to return home based on Tosafos understanding of the end of the Mishna 44b. The Mishna says - יל היוצאים להציל חוזרין למקומן Dassed on the context of the Mishna we are speaking about those who left home with the "permission" of the Rabbonon so that they can tend to a pikuach nefesh type situation, and returning home would violate techum and also violate carrying their weapons. The gemorah permits them to even carry their weapons home. Tosafos explains that the nature of this heter is התירו סופן משום. We need to permit them to return home, otherwise they are not going to go at all.

Based on this approach, Rav Moshe understands that although all the cases in Beitza (11b) of התירו סופן משום תחילתו, only violate a Rabbinic prohibition, we learn from our sugya that we apply the concept even to permit the violation of a Torah prohibition since by not doing so there is a risk that one will not go to save lives.

Rav Shlomo Zalman (Minchas Shlomo 8) after asking permission from Rav Moshe to publish his disagreement has a long teshuva where he argues on Rav Moshe.

According to Rav Shlomo Zalman it is only permitted to violate a Rabbinic prohibition (i.e. instructing a non-Jew to drive oneself home). This is the generally accepted practice.

Something for the Shabbos table

Daily after Shacharis & Maariy

The Torah tells us of an incident where a Jew went and cursed Hashem. Hashem tells Moshe to remove the blasphemer outside the camp and he shall be stoned.

The Rabbenu Bachya questions why the Torah found it necessary to record this incident. If the purpose is to teach us that this action is a capital offense, it would have been sufficient to record the Halacha without noting that there had been a man who was actually guilty of this action.

He explains that by providing the background to the incident – the fact that the man was a child of an Israeli woman who had intermarried with an Egyptian man (see Vayikra 24:10,11) – the Torah teaches us that a Jew will only be guilty of such a terrible aveira if there is a defect in his background. Were it not for the fact that the man's father had been an Egyptian and his mother a woman who left the fold, it would be impossible for a Jewish child to sink to the level of cursing Hashem.

SHAVING/HAIRCUTS THIS FRIDAY

Since Lag Ba'omer falls on a Sunday one is permitted to shave and have a haircut this Friday in honour of Shabbos (R'ma 493,2). If one does not have a haircut on Friday, one should wait till Sunday morning before cutting ones hair. Jhis weeks Kiddush Roster:
