Halocha from the Daf

The Avnei Nezer (Orach Chaim 183:5) writes, that since there emerges from our Gemara (Eruvin 97a) the Halacha that the knot of Tefillin must be a permanent knot — kesher shel kayama — (see Tosafos here and to Menachos 35b), there is a problem that may frequently arise in borrowing Tefillin from another person: Often the person who borrows the Tefillin must change their size in order that they should fit, and he therefore has to undo the knot and re-tie it to size. Then, however, when the owner receives the Tefillin back, he will necessarily re-tie the knot to his size. If so, frequently the knot that the borrower tied in the Tefillin does not last for twenty-four hours – the criterion for a permanent knot. Why do we not conduct ourselves according to this stringency of the Avnei Nezer? R' Shlomo Zalman Auerbach (Teshuvos Minchas Shlomo, Tinyana 1:3) writes that the reason is because it is reasonable to distinguish between a knot that is made with the deliberate intent to undo it; and a case in which as far as you (the borrower) are concerned, the knot can remain in place forever.

Something for the Shabbos table

Daily after Shacharis & Maariy

The mitzvah that we do not grasp is the Porah Adumah - the Torah calls it a chok, ie a mitzvah that we do not understand. The question is, though, why did Hashem set it up that this particular mitzvah should be the quintessential chok?

The Shemen Hatov explains that Porah Adumah comes to purify tumah that comes from a dead person. When did death enter the world? It was as a result of Adam Harishon's sin, when Adam and Chavah ate from the tree of knowledge.

What tempted them to do so? Because the serpent told them that 'on the day you eat from it, you will be like G-D knowing good and evil' (Bereishis 3;4). In other words, the sin that caused death was based on the will to know everything. So the atonement is that we are given a mitzvah called Porah Adumah which purifies the impurity which results from death - and this mitzvah we do not have any knowledge of. The sin was a thirst for too much out-of-bounds knowledge, and the correction is the 'chok' - where we have no knowledge of how the mitzvah of the Porah Adumah works.
