Doing Business with Prohibited Foods

In the discussion trying to prove whether the language of "don't eat" in the Torah, automatically includes the prohibition to benefit, the Gemara Pesachim 23a tries to prove the point from sheratzim which are permitted to receive benefit from even though it says לא יאכל (yei'achel).

The Taz in Y.D. 117:16 points out that the contradiction in the pesukim that forbids selling lichatchila, but if it comes your way you can sell it and receive benefit, is the source that one is not allowed to buy and sell prohibited foods. The Gemara implies that the prohibition to do business with forbidden foods is d'oraysa, because it is derived from the contradiction in the pesukim שלכם implying its permitted and יהי implying that its forbidden. The compromise is that it is not an issur hana'ah but an issur to do business with forbidden foods (unless one just happens to end up with it).

Tosafos says explicitly that it is an issur d'oraysa. However, Tosafos limits the issur d'oraysa to include only selling items that are eatable. One can process soaps and lotions from non-kosher animals. The Rashba (cited in Taz) disagrees and holds that the nature of this issur is only d'rabonon due to a concern that one may come to eat from it. The Gemara strongly supports Tosafos against the Rashba.

Something for the Shabbos table

Chazal note that the first day of Pesach and Tisha B'Av always fall on the same day of the week in any given year. The Jewish calendar is teaching us that redemption (Pesach) and tragedy (Tisha B'Av) are interlinked -Hashem does not make us suffer for no reason. Tragedy, suffering, and galus, are means of purifying us and pushing us to seek Hashem in a world which looks like it is devoid of His Presence. Therefore, galus and tragedy are ultimately steps in bringing about our redemption. Indeed, this explains the fact that the Beis Hamikdash burnt in the afternoon of Tisha B'Av, yet that is the time when we lighten our mourning - we move to sit on normal chairs and put on Tallis and Tefillin. Surely the mourning should be increased in the afternoon if that's when the Temple burnt? The answer is that because the destruction of the Temple was necessary to ultimately cleanse us, ensure our survival, and pave the way for a lasting redemption, at the time when the Mikdash was burning we lighten the mourning - thus recognising the ultimate good behind even the greatest tragedy. This is the real nechama that exists on Tisha B'Av.
