

From the Rabbi's desk...

Every Yom Tov has its particular observances. Most of them have clear and finite Mitzvos and Minhogim. On Pesach we don't eat Chometz, we make a Seder, drink the four cups of wine etc. On Sukkos we take the Lulav and Esrog and sit in

However, the Yomim Noroim period is very different. In addition to the blowing of the shofar and the various customs of eating certain foods on Rosh Hashana, the following days are filled with a variety of nuances that seem to pop up at different hours of the day and affect us in different ways. Morning, afternoon and night there are activities that keep the spirit of the Yomim Noroim sustained until Yom Kippur and beyond.

Walk into shul, it looks different, it is adorned in white. We get up at least a half hour earlier for Selichos. We add in extra parts to our Tefillos that refer to Hashem as our King. Kaddish is changed with seemingly subtle amendments that bear the weight of fundamental change. Our foods are different as well; we abstain from sharp and sour substances, replacing them with sweet ones.

We become very used to all these changes, however we need to ask ourselves, what is the purpose of all these nuances? Will they really change our attitude towards life?

Rav Mordechai Kamenetzky brings the following story to answer this question:

In the mid 1920s a chossid once approached the Imrei Emes, "Rebbe, I am travelling to Paris on a ten day business trip. Would the Rebbe give me a brocha that I be successful in my venture?"

After a warm blessing the Rebbe continued to make his own request. "In Paris they sell an exclusive cigar brand that is reputed to be the best in all of Western Europe. I would appreciate if you would find that brand and bring

The chossid was puzzled by the request, but responded enthusiastically.

"Of course Rebbe! No problem. I will find out which is the best brand in all of France and bring you back

The man went on his trip and indeed returned two weeks later. He visited the Rebbe to thank him for his

"Do you have the cigars?" asked the Rebbe. The man blushed. "Rebbe, you have to forgive me. When I was in Paris, I was so immersed in business that I totally forgot about your request. But do not worry. On the way back I made a special stop in Belgium and got you the best
Belgium cigar available. I was assured that it is of equal quality to the French cigar if not better!"

The Rebbe shook his head. "My dear chossid, I did not need cigars. The reason I asked you to get me the cigars while you were in France is because I wanted those cigars to be on your mind. In that manner you would remember during your stay there that you have a Rebbe."

Explained Rav Kamenetzky, of course each one of these nuances may represent an important symbolism, but that there is something more. During these days we must keep on inserting tiny wake up calls that shout out to us, "Remember the Rebbe!"

Switching words, opening the Aron Kodesh, watching our foods all may be minor acts but in the greater picture they are reminders that we are living in a very spiritual and holy period and Our King is waiting for us to remember Him. We live in a world that is filled with distractions. We become

immersed in our world and often forget about the bigger picture. During the Yomim Noroim we have the opportunity to come close to Hakodosh Boruch Hu. He is here, close to us! Let's make the most of it! Wishing you and your family a Kesiva V'Chasima Tova
