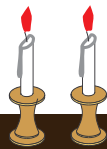

Halocha from the Daf

The Gemorah in Pesachim 112 says that if food or drink is stored underneath a bed there is a ruach rah that rests on it. This Halacha is also brought in Shulchan Aruch.

How, exactly, do we define "underneath a bed" as regards this halocha?

"Underneath a bed" means that it was stored on the ground under a bed in which someone was sleeping. Therefore:

It is permitted to place food on top of the bottom bed of a bunk bed, even if someone is asleep on the top bed (Rav S Z Auerbach).

It is permitted to place food underneath a baby's carriage, even if a baby is sleeping in the carriage (Minchas Yitzchok).

Most poskim permit storing food under a couch or bed which is not being used for sleeping.

It is permitted to place food underneath a bench [or an airplane seat], even if the bench is used for sleeping, since a bench is not a bed.

Something for the Shabbos table

In this week's Parsha, when the time comes for Avrohom to separate from Lot, Avrohom poses the following deal to Lot: 'the entire land is in front of you - if you go left I'll go right, and if you go right I'll go left' (13:9).

The Netziv asks an interesting question; why does Avrohom need to move, let Lot go left/right and Avrohom should stay where he is? Why do they both need to move in opposite directions in order to be apart?

The Netziv answers that Avrohom wanted to show that he cared for Lot and his feelings. In order that Lot should not feel troubled and bothered for having to move, Avrohom said that he would also undergo the ordeal of moving all his possessions away. Just like you, Lot, move one way, I, Avrohom will move the other way - that way we'll both have the same exertion.

Such is the way of a tzaddik; he cares for even the smallest of things when it comes to others feelings.
