Halocha from the Daf

Do not pass over the opportunity to do a mitzvah

The Gemorah in Yoma 33a brings a halocha from Reish Lakish who said, one should not pass a mitzvah. Rashi explains that when one comes upon a mitzvah opportunity he should not pass it up.

Tosafos explains that when one has the opportunity to perform two mitzvos one should perform the mitzvah which presents itself first but if one will perform only one mitzvah it does not have to be performed at the first available

For example, Mishnah Berurah writes that if a person is ready to perform the mitzvah of Talis and Tefillin and it happens to be that the Tefillin are closer, one is not permitted to reach over the Tefillin in order to be able to put on the Talis first. Even though under ideal conditions the Talis is put on before Tefillin, nonetheless, in this case the principle of אין מעבירין על applies and it is prohibited to pass over the Tefillin to reach the Talis. If, however, one is not planning to wear Tefillin now it is permitted to reach over the Tefillin to get to

The Birkei Yosef writes that if a person's Shabbos Talis is on top of or in front of his weekday Talis or vice versa, it is permitted to reach over one to get to the other if the further Talis is the one that he wants.

Something for the Shabbos table

In this week's Parsha, Yaakov blesses each of his children before he dies. Yehudah receives a relatively large brocha, and included in it is an acknowledgment that he has "elevated himself" (Genesis 49:9).

Rashi explains that one of the things that this refers to is Yehudah's admission of guilt after the incident with Tamar several parshiyos ago. Yehudah had wrongfully accused her of a fault and decreed the harsh punishment of death upon her. When he found out that it was in truth his own mistake and not hers, he publicly admitted that he was wrong, something which is not so easy for people to do, especially when one's reputation is on the line. It took a big man like Yehudah to admit the truth, and he was rewarded for it.

We can take this message and apply it to our lives as well. Whenever we are in a situation in which we initially thought that we are right and we suddenly realize we are wrong, we should not cover up our mistake in order to save face. Rather, we should admit the truth, even though it may bring us shame, for ultimately it will be to our benefit.
