#### Halocha from the Daf

The Mishna in Beitzah (36b) says that one may not give Kiddushin on Yom Tov. The reason marriage is not permitted on Yom Tov is that the act of kiddushin is similar to a business deal, which is prohibited on Yom Tov (also see Mishna Berurah 339:15 who also brings the concern that one may come to write).

Accordingly, Poskim question whether it is permitted to give a gift on Shabbos and Yom Tov. Are all transactions prohibited, including gift giving, or perhaps only those transactions that involve an exchange of money or merchandise?

The Rambam rules that one who sells property or gives a gift has violated a Rabbinic prohibition. The Maggid Mishna cites our Mishna as the source for this ruling.

The Beis Meir demonstrates from an earlier Gemara that it is permitted to give gifts on Shabbos, where sending Tefillin to another person is allowed. This clearly proves that it is permitted to give a gift on Yom Tov. The ruling of Rambam, explains the Beis Meir, is limited to giving gifts of land which require an exchange transaction – קנין חליפין. This kinyan resembles a business transaction since each party is giving something to the other. A gift, on the other hand, does not resemble a business transaction since only one item is being transferred. Mishna Berurah rules like the Rambam and prohibits gift giving because of its similarity to business.

### Something for the Shabbos table

The opening possuk of Behar singles out that the mitzvah of Shmittah - and all of its details - was relayed to Moshe at Har Sinai. Though this was true of all mitzvos, Shmittah has one difference to it. Whilst the full details of other mitzvos were told to Moshe on Har Sinai and later fully relayed to the people from the Ohel Mo'ed, in the case of Shmittah the entire mitzvah was told at Har Sinai. Why is Shmittah different?

One answer is that Shmittah is an intensive Bitachon-course. In leaving one's field fallow for a whole year at HaShem's Command, one shows utter and complete reliance upon HaShem and recognition of Him as the ultimate Provider of everything. [And this mitzvah is the longest mitzvah we have]. Thus, after experiencing the high-voltage inspiration and one-off revelation of HaShem at Har Sinai, we were told this mitzvah of Shmittah to pin down and concretise our newfound level of Emunah and Bitachon.
