#### Something for the Shabbos table

At the end of Parshas Bo we are told about Tefillin. They are to be 'as a sign on your arm and 'letotafos' between your eyes' (13:16).

Rashi quotes that 'letotafos' means 'four' and comes from a combination of the Caspian and African language, and so the Torah is telling us that the Tefillin Shel Rosh are to be made of four parts.

But the question is why did Hashem write a word in foreign languages in the Torah - and why especially regarding the Tefillin Shel Rosh?

One can suggest the following answer; the Tefillin Shel Rosh and Tefillin Shel Yad fulfil different roles. The Shel Yad are to be a private witness to our connection with Hashem; that's why we cover it over with our shirt sleeves. But the Gemorah tells us that the Tefillin Shel Rosh is called 'our glory' because we show the other nations that we are Hashem's Chosen People (see Ramban on this possuk). This is why the Torah speaks about the Tefillin Shel Rosh in another language, to reflect that the Tefillin Shel Rosh are to give a message to other nations.
