TEFILLIN SHAYLA: WASHING HANDS AFTER TOUCHING THE UPPER ARM

In most cases, when placing or removing the Tefillin Shel Yad, one touches the upper arm with his hand. We know the Halocha is that if one touches a part of the body that is usually covered one needs to wash ones hands. The question arises whether this is required in our case, since the upper arm is usually considered a covered part of the body (See MB 4:54). Although some poskim say one should wash ones hands (Beis Boruch 1:2:50), the minhag is that one does not have to wash ones hands in this situation. The reason is because since that part of the arm is revealed when putting on Tefillin it is not considered a place which is normally covered. When removing Tefillin, if one touches the bottom part of the retzuos (which touch the skin) no washing is required.

Something for the Shabbos table

Rashi at the beginning of the Parsha writes: "Korach was an intelligent man. What reason did he have to commit this sin? The answer is that his eye misled him. He prophetically saw that a line of great men would descend from him, amongst them Shmuel HaNavi, who was equal in importance to Moshe and Aharon together. Therefore Korach said to himself, 'On his [Shmuel's] account I shall escape the punishment'." R' Boruch Sorotzkin z"I asks: why does Rashi write that Korach's "eye" (singular) misled him? After all, a person has two eyes! Indeed, we read at the end of last week's parashah (15:39), "You shall not explore after your heart and after your eyes (plural)."

He explains: One of the distinguishing characteristics of a tzadik is that he looks at every issue from multiple perspectives and does not jump to conclusions based on his first impression. Rashi is teaching that Korach did not do this. He used only one eye, so-to-speak, and therefore was misled. (For example, he did not consider the possibility that he would be punished, but his sons would repent and be saved, as in fact happened.)

R' Sorotzkin adds that the above lesson is closely related to the teaching in Pirkei Avos: "You shall judge kol ha'adam favourably." The expression "kol ha'adam" usually is translated, "every person." Literally, however, it means, "the whole person." The Mishna is teaching that when we judge the whole person - when we look at him from numerous angles to see all of his strengths and weaknesses and all of the circumstances that affect his life - we will be likely to judge him favourably.
