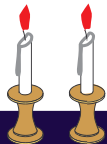

Halachic Insights

Hilchos Purim #1

Does one have to repeat Bentching if Al HaNisim was forgotten?

The Mishna Berura (695:15) brings a machlokes haposkim if one who forgot Al Hanisim in bentching must repeat the bentching. The Mishna Berura invokes the concept of safek berachos lehakel, if one is in doubt as to whether to make a beracha one should not make the beracha. Therefore, one should not repeat the bentching. However, if one realized before he said the shem Hashem of the beracha of "al ha'aretz ve'al hamazon" then he should go back and say Al Hanisim and continue from there. But, as soon as the shem Hashem was uttered, one should finish the brocha and continue in bentching.

If one davened Maariv in the middle of his Seudas Purim, is Al HaNisim recited in bentching?

The Mishna Berura (695:16) brings another machlokes haposkim regarding this issue. He therefore suggest that one should always bentch before davening Mariv so as to avoid this shaila. The Mishna Berura does not say what to do if one did daven Mariv first. The Aruch Hashulchan (695:11) paskens not to say Al Hanisim in such a case.

Something for the Shabbos table

In this week's parsha, after being told to anoint Aharon, Moshe was told in reference to Aharon's sons: 'And you shall anoint them as you anointed their father'.

The Meshech Chochmah explained that when Moshe was told to anoint his brother Aharon he was able to do it with a complete heart. Moshe, the younger brother, was the leader of the Bnei Yisroel and was happy that his brother was the Kohen Godol. But in reference to Aharon's sons, the situation was different. Moshe's own sons were not going to succeed him as leaders. So when it came to anointing Aharon's sons Moshe might have felt envy. Therefore Hashem told Moshe to anoint Aharon's sons with the same wholeheartedness and joy with which he anointed their father. We see from here that even the greatest people need to internalize attitudes that will help them avoid envy. Moreover, we see that it is possible to feel joy and enthusiasm for another person's success even if that person has something that you do not.
