Insight from the Daf

The Gemara relates that a person who salvages an object from a thief is permitted to keep that object. Later authorities note that a ruling in Shulchan Aruch seems inconsistent with this statement of the Gemara. The Shulchan Aruch (CM 361:5) rules that a change of ownership applies only when the thief gives the stolen object to another person but if someone was to forcibly take the stolen object from the thief it is not considered as if the object has undergone a "change of ownership." Why then is a person who salvages a stolen object permitted to keep that object if there has not been a "change of ownership?" The Taz suggests that the Gemara refers to a case where the thief knowingly gave the stolen object away and when the Gemara uses the phrase, "salvaged" it means he salvaged it from the thief by appeasing him to give it away. If, however, it was forcefully taken away from the thief it would be necessary to return the object to its owner since it has not yet gone through a change of ownership.

Something for the Shabbos table

In this week's Parsha the Torah brings a whole list of curses that may come upon man. At the end it says tells us the cause – 'Because you did not serve Hashem, your G-d, with joy and with a good heart when you had everything'

Rabbi Simcha Zissel of Kelm asked: Isn't this an extremely severe penalty for not reaching a high level?

He explained that if people give thought to what it means to fulfil Hashem's will, they would carry it out with joy and enthusiasm. But if someone lacks joy when he does Hashem's will, it will not last and will eventually lead to his lack of fulfilment of other Mitzvos. Therefore joy is a key attribute and is fundamental for the observance of the entire Torah. To tell someone: 'either feel joy or you will be punished,' is more likely to have a negative effect than a positive one. A person cannot be forced into feeling sincere joy. But the stronger your awareness of the greatness of Hashem, the size of His universe, the length of eternity, and the benefits of observing His Mitzvos, the

of observing His Mitzvos, the greater will be the joy when you carry out the will of Hashem.
