### Insight from the Daf

The Gemorah (Makos 19) teaches that just as the halachos regarding a firstborn animal (בכור) do not apply when there is no Bais HaMikdash, so too, it is prohibited to eat maser sheni without a Bais HaMikdash although it is obligatory to separate it from one's produce. It is also prohibited to redeem maaser sheni in Yerushalayim despite the absence of the Bais HaMikdash. For this reason the Rambam rules that one may not separate maser sheni in Yerushalayim nowadays. The produce is taken out of Yerushalayim, ma'aser sheni is separated there and then redeemed. In the event that one did separate ma'aser sheni in Yerushalayim it must be left to rot. The Sefer Ir Hakodesh V'HaMikdash elaborates on the dispute between Rambam and Raavad whether the original sanctity continues even after the Bais HaMikdash no longer exists and how they explain our Gemorah. According to Raavad, who maintains that the original sanctity does not continue after the destruction of the Bais HaMikdash, the reason we do not eat maaser sheni nowadays is that we do not have walls around Yerushalayim. According to Rambam, who maintains that the sanctity of the city is still in place, the reason ma'aser sheni may not be consumed in Yerushalayim is, as our Gemorah explains, ma'aser sheni is equated with the halacha of the firstborn and the absence of the altar is what prohibits.

#### Something for the Shabbos table

A large portion of the parsha revolves around the birth of the shevatim. The Seforno (Bereishis 30:16) comments that these pesukim convey that the great efforts invested by Rachel and Leah in order to merit children, were worthy in the eyes of Hashem. Both allowed their maidservants to share in their relationship with Yaakov as a zechus that they should merit to bear shevatim. Additionally, the story of the dudai'm portrays that bearing shevatim was of the highest priority in the eyes of Rachel and Leah. The Seforno writes that it was these actions that caused Hashem to answer their tefillos: "For it is worthy for a righteous person to attempt to achieve his desires with whatever natural means that he might have, and along with this he should daven to achieve his goal."

Why is it not simply enough for a person to daven that he succeed in achieving his desires? Rav Wolbe explains that if one wishes to achieve something and he davens for it but fails to take any action, his lack of investing effort generally demonstrates that he does not truly desire it. Conversely, one who only takes action and does not offer a prayer for success, demonstrates that he relies completely upon his brains and brawn. One who feels that he does not need Heavenly assistance, certainly cannot expect to achieve the desired results. Combining the natural with the supernatural should be our

formula for achieving our goals.
