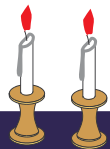

Halocha Insight

ADJUSTING A FLAME ON YOM TOV

While one mustn't ignite a new flame on Yom Tov (Shulchan Aruch OC 502:1), one is allowed to light a new flame from an existing one or turn a flame up. This only applies to a gas flame - not to an electric stove - and may only be done for cooking purposes, etc.

R' Moshe Feinstein (Igros Moshe OC 1:93; 1:115; 4:103) writes that one may turn the flame down to prevent food from burning though shouldn't do so just to save money or to cool the kitchen down, etc. R' Avrohom Blumenkrantz (Chasdei Avrohom 31) explains the rationale behind this. While one can't turn down a wick or remove oil from a lit lamp on Yom Tov, turning down a gas flame is akin to not adding more fuel to a fire.

R' Yehoshua Neuwirth (Shemiras Shabbos Kehilchasa 13:10) writes that one shouldn't turn the flame down unless there is no other flame, though R' Moshe allowed one to do so even if one could light another smaller flame. The Shearim Metzuyananim Behalacha (98:13) writes that as it is dangerous to leave an extra flame on, there is no need to do so.

Something for the Shabbos table

While superficially it seems that the various Yomim Tovim were designated merely as days which commemorate what occurred in years gone by, the Ramchal informs us that there is much more to these Holy Days. Encapsulated in every Yom Tov is the unique spiritual illumination (he'arah) that was present at the time of the occurrence which the Yom Tov commemorates. For example, every year when Pesach arrives, one has the ability to tap into the wellsprings of emunah and freedom from spiritual bondage that were present at the time of Yetzias Mitzrayim. With this in mind, writes Rav Wolbe we must ask what is the spiritual he'arah that is unique to the Yom Tov of Rosh Hashana.

In mussaf of Rosh Hashana we proclaim, "This is the day of the beginning of Your handiwork - a remembrance for the first day." The handiwork mentioned here refers to the creation of man. Each year on Rosh Hashana every person has the ability to tap into the spirituality unique to this day and recreate himself as a new person.

Adam Harishon was created with awesome spiritual potential. Chazal tell us (Sanhedrin 39b) that, spiritually speaking, his height reached the heavens and his breadth spanned the world. Accordingly, the spiritual he'arah of Rosh Hashana was not merely given as a means of renewing our actions while retaining our previous spiritual stature. Rather, Rosh Hashana was given to us to enable us to elevate our stature and bring it to newfound heights.
