Shabbos Chanukah Halochos

Halochos relating to Shabbos Chanukah

If possible, one should daven Mincha on Friday before lighting Chanukah candles. There are two reasons for davening Mincha first: 1) The afternoon Tamid sacrifice, which corresponds to our Mincha service, was always brought before the lighting of the Menorah in the Beis HaMikdash. 2) Davening Mincha after lighting Chanukah candles appears contradictory, since Mincha "belongs" to Friday, while the Chanukah candles "belong" to Shabbos. If no early minyan is available, then it is better to light first and daven with a minyan afterwards. The oil or candles should be able to burn for at least half an hour after nightfall (9:50pm). If the oil and candles cannot possibly burn that long, one does not fulfil the mitzvah even b'diavad, according to some opinions. If one neglected to put in enough oil and realized his error only after lighting the menorah, he may not add more oil. He must rather extinguish the flame, add oil, and then re-kindle the wick. The brochos, however, are not repeated. If one does not have enough oil for all the wicks to burn for the correct time one must make sure that at least one light has enough oil to burn that long.

Something for the Shabbos table

Chanukah is said to be the 'festival' of the Oral Torah, so why is there no Gemorah about Chanukah? When it comes to Purim, Pesach and Succos there is a mesechta devoted to these Yomim Tovim but why not by Chanukah?

Rav Nissan Kaplan shlit"a suggests a beautiful answer: The Greeks did not try to destroy us physically, they tried to destroy our Torah - our identity. So, when it was time for Rebbe Yehudah Hanasi to write down the Mishnayos due to fear that the Jewish People would start to forget the Oral Torah, to some extent, the Greeks had succeeded. They had taken our Oral Torah and to a degree, reduced it. However, when it came to Chanukah, the time when we celebrate our success over the Greeks and their values, Rebbe Yehudah Hanasi could not let Chanukah be written down into Mishnayos, Chanukah had to remain as the Oral Torah in its unchanged form.

So even though the Greeks succeeded in a way, by causing our Oral Torah to be written down, at least when it came to Chanukah, the 'festival of the Oral Torah', that would have to be learned totally orally without any Mishnayos.
