## Interesting Halacha

**Decorating the Shul with flowers** 

The Rema (OC 494:3) writes that many have the minhag to place herbs in shuls and their homes over Shavuos to commemorate the giving of the Torah. The Mishna Berura (494:10) explains that there was grass or herbs on Har Sinai.

The Magen Avraham extends this minhag to trees, writing that as we are judged on Shavuos over the fruit, the trees should remind us to daven for a good produce (See Shulchan Aruch Harav 494:15). R' Ovadia Yosef quotes midrashim to explain why people place flowers.

The poskim quote the Vilna Gaon who decried the practice of placing trees in shuls as it has become the practice of idolaters. Thus, some shuls don't place any plants in their shuls (See Aruch Hashulchan OC 494:6).

R' Ovadia Yosef explains however, why this isn't a concern and writes that this is an important minhag. Additionally, it seems that while the Vilna Gaon disapproved of laying out trees, there would be no issue with herbs and plants.

## Something for the Shabbos table

Rav Yisroel Salanter points out that there is no specific date in the Torah for Shavous. The Torah just says it falls out on the 50th day of the Omer. There is a Machlokes in the Gemora as to when it can falls out, it could fall out on the 6th or 7th of Sivan, depending on how many days Nissan and Iyar are that year.

Rav Salanter points out that this hazy timing of the Yom Tov is to teach us that Torah is not dependant on time. We should not focus on one day, one time when we received the Torah. Matan Torah is every day.

Rav Hirsch says the same idea. He points out that there is no Mitzvah D'Oraiso specific to Shavous. We say kiddush and other things like we do on other Yomim Tovim, however we don't have a specific mitzvah like to eat matzah or to eat in a sukkah, etc.

Rav Hirsch explains that this is because we don't want to link anything specific to Matan Torah.

Other Yomim Tovim have this link, Pesach and Matzah, Sukkos and Lulav, Rosh Hashanah and shofar etc. When there is a mitzvah associated with the day we naturally focus our thoughts on performing that mitzvah.

Shavous is supposed to be a regular day when we are mekabel the Torah and just like a regular day doesn't have specific mitzvos so too Shavous doesn't. Our focus on Matan Torah should be for all our

lives, not just on Shavous itself!!
